

Marc Shargel is the author of three richly illustrated coffee table photo books, the Wonders of the Sea series, and a booklet on local marine resource history, Yesterday's Ocean. His images have won prizes in the Environmentally aware Photographic Image Competition (EPIC), the Underwater Images Photo Contest, The Monterey Shootout, and others. His images have been published in marine biology books. magazines, on websites and in numerous environmental publications. All three titles in his vibrantly colorful Wonders of the Sea series can be found at Pro Scuba Dive Center.

Shargel's energetic speaking style has entertained university students, scuba clubs and visitors to aquaria from San Diego to Arcata. In 2013 he presented a talk at TEDx in Monterey. Shargel has been an advocate for marine protected areas for over 15 years; from 2004 to 2006 he served on a state panel that mapped out new marine protected areas along the Central California Coast.

Every classroom meeting will include time to analyze-and learn from-our successes and failures. We'll study our cameras and how they work (shutter speeds, f-stops and light metering), sunlight and strobe lighting, macro photography, and more. The cost of the boat (about \$100) is not included in the class fee. Likewise the rental of any equipment you may need, is additional. This class will be limited to 12 students to make sure we can answer individual questions, and to keep the boat under capacity.
